## Care Plan for the Dying Person Health Professional ...

The following questions can help guide your assessment5: • Is the person ' s functional status deteriorating (bedbound, weak, drowsy, unable to swallow or only taking sips of fluid, minimal oral intake, semi-comatose)? • Is there a reversible cause for the deterioration such as opioid toxicity, renal failure, hypercalcemia or infection?
